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Effectiveness of Educational Videos for Learning The Concept of Bullying in Elementary School

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Abstract

Bullying or bullying has become a serious problem in the primary school environment. These actions can leave a deep psychological impact on children, especially in terms of adaptation and socialization. Bullying is defined as aggressive behavior carried out intentionally and repeatedly, with an imbalance of power between the perpetrator and the victim. The impact of bullying on victims is very diverse, including anxiety, depression, low self-confidence, to aggressive behavior. Given the magnitude of this negative impact, a study was carried out to address the problem through the use of educational videos. The main purpose of this study was to help learners identify the dominant values conveyed in educational videos about bullying. In addition, the study also aimed to compare students ' understanding of bullying before and after watching the educational video. The data collection method used in this study involved interviews and observations, with the results presented in Tabular Form. Quantitative data analysis showed an increase in students ' ability to identify moral values contained in educational videos. Furthermore, significant differences were found between students ' understanding before and after being given educational video treatment. The results of the sample study showed that after watching the educational video, 36 students understood the concept of bullying well, 3 students had less understanding, and only 1 student still did not understand bullying. 2. Research Methods



Before using educational videos The results of this study are quite alarming. Of the 40 students sampled in the study, only 12 students demonstrated a good understanding of the concept of bullying and its associated moral values. Another 28 students are still confused and do not fully understand the negative impact of bullying. These findings indicate a significant gap in understanding among students.

After using educational videos Data analysis showed quite encouraging results. A total of 90% (36) of the students in the study sample had demonstrated a good understanding of bullying and its associated moral values after participating in the intervention program. However, there are still 10% (4) of students who need further attention to ensure a comprehensive understanding of the issue of bullying.
